PREPARING FOR A PROCEDURE

In preparing for your procedure we ask that you follow a few simple rules:

- 1. **PLEASE DO NOT EAT** any solid food or drink any non-approved liquids within **8 hours** of your procedure time.
- 2. Please take your regular medicines on the day of the procedure **with the exception of insulin**. We have specific instructions for **diabetics on insulin**. See below.
- 3. Potent platelet inhibiting drugs (e.g. Plavix; Ticlid) and/or Coumadin (Warfarin) must be stopped prior to epidural injections. See below.

Our "official procedure" instruction sheet is below.

All patients are required to have a driver to take them home.

OK to eat/drink the following:

All solids up to <u>8 hours</u> prior to procedure Clear liquids up to <u>4 hours</u> prior to procedure

Clear Liquids that **ARE** approved:

- 1. Black coffee (no creamers of any kind or milk; sugar OK)
- 2. Juices apple, grape, cranberry. No pulp of any kind allowed.
- **3.** Water

Diabetics on Insulin

- 1. A.M. appointments: Take 1/2 your dosage of insulin and drink clear liquid.
- 2. P.M. appointments: Take a full dosage of insulin, drink clear liquid; may eat Breakfast before 8A.M.
- **3**. Take all your regular oral (by mouth) medications, especially your blood pressure medicines on the day of the injection.

ANTICOAGULANT ("blood thinner") policy:

- You MUST check with your primary care physician and/or cardiologist to confirm that you can temporarily discontinue your blood thinning medicine around the time of an epidural injection(s).
- NSAIDs/ASA/"Arthritis Medicines" e.g. aspirin; Celebrex (celecoxib); Motrin (ibuprofen); Aleve (naproxen); Mobic (meloxicam), etc. NO restrictions.
- NOTE: If patient is <u>also</u> taking one of the drugs listed below stop NSAIDs 7 days prior to procedure
- Coumadin stop 7 days prior to procedure
- Plavix (clopidogrel) 7 days prior to procedure
- Ticlid (Ticlopidine) 14 days prior to procedure
- Enoxaparin sodium (Lovenox)
 - ▶ dosage regimen 30mg SC q 12h or up to 40 mg SC once daily: last dose <u>12 hours prior</u> to injection; first post-injection dose 12 hours after injection
 - ▶ higher dosage regimens (i.e. 1.5 mg/kg SC once daily or 1 mg/kg SC twice daily): last dose <u>24 hours prior</u> to injection; first post-injection dose <u>24 hours after</u> injection
- Platelet GP IIb/IIIa receptor antagonists, including abciximab (Reopro), eptifibatide (Integrilin), and tirofiban (Aggrastat) 48 hours prior to procedure
